## FINANCIAL REPORT 2023 / 2024

Following this Financial Report are the 2023-2024 Financial Statements, together with summarised graphs of income and expenditure and Polio NSW reserves.

The Financial Year under review is a little unusual in that whilst there has been plenty going on out-of-office, as described in the Annual Report, it has largely been done by volunteers rather than employed staff. Our part-time staff, Fatma and Shylie, have done a brilliant job keeping the office running, bills paid and information flowing to members. As in most organisations the backroom people remain the heroes.

Turning to the Income and Expenditure Statement, we had total revenue of \$29,369 made up of Membership fees \$7,105; Donations from members \$19,187; Interest on deposits \$3,037; and a small amount from the sale of books. Donations were down this year largely due to the timing of membership renewals being sent out, as donations need to be taken up in the year received because of the accounting rules.

Expenditure was in line with expectations at \$22,623, leaving a small profit for the year of \$6,746. Of note was a contribution to Polio Australia towards the ongoing operation of the Late Effects of Polio Health Worker Education Program which benefits members through health practitioners you consult having a better understanding of post-polio issues.

Over the last few years, the Board has worked hard at stabilising the structure of Polio NSW in order to ensure financial viability into the future. It is recognised that we are all getting older, but "We're Still Here!", as the poster proclaims, and all members have a right to be represented and an expectation that Polio NSW is there to provide some support. The restructuring has achieved a streamlining of some functions and an improved efficiency of some processes. As can be seen from the revenues listed above, the organisation remains dependent on the generosity of existing members through your donations, for which we always offer our thanks.

I am confident that with your help we will continue to be here to help well into the future.

### Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

#### **Basis of Preparation**

The financial report is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (including Australian Interpretations) of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB). The organisation is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Compliance with Australian Accounting Standards ensures that the financial statements and notes also comply with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).

Given that Polio NSW is a non-reporting entity, an explanation of notes to the financial reports is not required.

Regardless, detailing the accounting policies in these notes:

- a. Conveys the principles upon which the financial reports have been prepared, and
- b. Will assist the reader understand how a figure was arrived at.


Accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

#### a. Provisions

Provisions have been recognised when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result. The provision value is the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation ascertained at the end of the reporting period.

#### b. Bequest Funds

In the 2015 financial year Mr Roger Smith bequeathed \$5,000 for the benefit of the ACT Support Group to be held by Polio NSW. None of the funds were requested by the ACT Support Group or paid during the 2024 financial year. Accordingly, the closing balance of funds held by Polio NSW for the ACT Support Group as at 30 June 2024 remains at \$1,000.


